



Top Ten Reasons to Live in Manitoba

1. Natural beauty and recreation - Manitobans have one of the highest rates of vacation home ownership in Canada. Our province is home to over 100,000 lakes and for generations Manitobans have enjoyed weekends



at lakefront cottages and cabins with family and friends. Manitoba's many beautiful provincial parks are year-round havens for campers, fishers, hikers and lovers of the great outdoors.

2. Festivals and events - Folklorama is our annual celebration of our cultural diversity. Dozens of community groups host pavilions for visitors to share in ethnic food, culture, music and song. Festival du Voyageur is our winter festival in the French quarter, St. Boniface. The Royal Winnipeg Ballet is world-renown. And we have professional soccer, football, baseball and hockey teams.

3. Commuting distance - The average commuting distance to work in Winnipeg is less than 8 km, the lowest of any Canadian city with a population over 500,000.



4. Housing costs - Manitoba remains one of the least expensive locations in which to purchase a home. A recently published survey identifies Winnipeg as Canada's top-ranked city in terms of housing affordability.

5. Low car insurance rates - In some Canadian provinces you would pay twice as much for auto insurance as you pay in Manitoba.



6. Golf - Manitoba has one of the highest ratios of golf courses to golfers in Canada with more than 120 beautiful public and private courses.

7. Low electricity rates - Manitoba's electricity rates are consistently among the lowest in the world. Our province is committed to developing energy conservation programs as well as exploring new sources of green energy.



8. Excellent education system - Manitoba's five universities and three community colleges offer high-quality advanced education with some of Canada's lowest tuition fees.

9. Friendliness and generosity - Manitobans rank high for participation in volunteer work to support community causes and we have the highest proportion of charitable giving of any province.

10. Home building boom - Housing starts are up 85% over the past five years. In 2008 Manitoba had the second-strongest growth in housing starts in Canada and growth is expected to continue.
